

Success story: Operating Assistance for Island Explorer Shuttle Service at Acadia National Park — This project consists of providing funding to cover a portion of the operating expenses of the Island Explorer shuttle service over a two-year period in Hancock County Maine. This will allow the Island Explorer to expand its operations by filling gaps in service and increase its service frequency. The planned improvements include adding an additional evening bus to provide a 9:00 pm departure from the Village Green, an early morning and lunch departures on the Loop Road Route, an early morning departure for the Jordan Pond Route, and the operation of a second School bus when the new campground and parking area are opened in 2015 to increase the service from every 60 minutes to 30 minutes.

The Island Explorer protects and enhances Maine's tourism economy by ensuring that residents and visitors continue to have safe, environmentally sustainable, unrestricted access to Acadia National Park.





FLAP Project Selection Process

Each FLAP project was selected from a pool of applications submitted by the facility owner in response to a state-wide call for projects. The applications were screened, rated, and ranked using PDC approved rating criteria. The PDC unanimously agreed which projects met the established State program goals and conformed with the project ranking criteria contained in the “Call for Projects SOP”. Based upon these evaluations, the proposed projects were recommended for programming within the available funding for each state. Memorandum of Agreements (MOA) were coordinated and executed for each programmed project prior to obligation of FLAP funds. There was one call for projects, from June 16, 2014 until August 22, 2014, that generated two applications totaling \$741,200 funds requested.
