**Success story:** The City of Grandview Truman Farmhouse Multi-use Trail Project will complete the Truman Farm Home Trail, a 2 ½ mile multiuse trail between the National Park Service Harry S Truman National Historic Site and US Army Corps of Engineers Longview Lake.

This project will construct the remaining 1 ¾ mile of multiuse trail along Truman Road from 125<sup>th</sup> Street to the existing multiuse trail at Longview Lake. The new 10-foot trail will be on the north side of Harry Truman Drive along existing City of Grandview right-of-way from 125<sup>th</sup> Street to South View Drive, then cross over and follow Harry Truman Drive on the south side to Longview Drive.

The trail will have ADA compliant accessibility features such as modified curb ramps, ramp delineation with truncated domes, and signing, striping, and accessible pedestrian signals for crossing locations. An existing culvert west of South View Drive will be modified by utilizing the existing culvert headwall as a base to build a structurally integrated wall with pedestrian fence for safety. At this location, the trail would be narrowed to the existing 4-foot wide width.

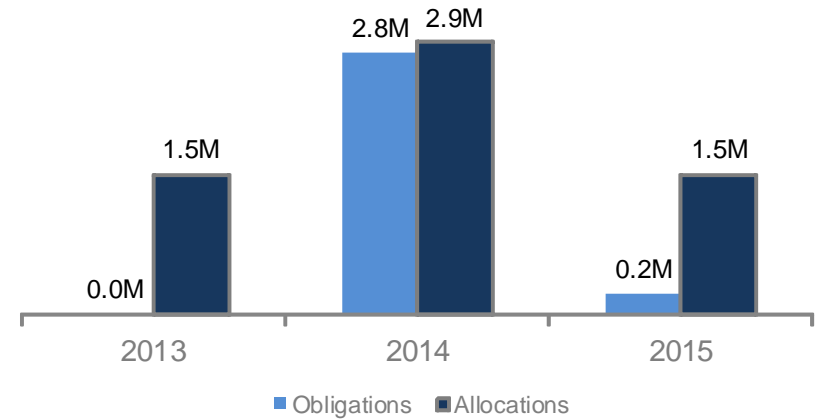
This separated multi-use path will provide safe bicycle and pedestrian access to two federal properties with cultural resources as well as several local parks. Increasing access to additional users of these facilities will improve exposure and visitation, thereby increasing preservation awareness and providing economic benefits.

### FLAP Project Selection Process

Each FLAP project was selected from a pool of applications submitted by the facility owner in response to a state-wide call for projects. The applications were screened, rated, and ranked using PDC approved rating criteria. The PDC unanimously agreed which projects met the established State program goals and conformed with the project ranking criteria contained in the “Call for Projects SOP”. Based upon these evaluations, the proposed projects were recommended for programming within the available funding for each state. Memorandum of Agreements (MOA) were coordinated and executed for each programmed project prior to obligation of FLAP funds. There was one call for projects, from August 15, 2013 until November 4, 2013, that generated 16 applications totaling \$10,830,000 funds requested.
