FEDERAL LANDS HIGHWAY (FLH)




FEDERAL LANDS HIGHWAY (FLH)

- Federal Lands Highway (FLH) is an office within the FHWA
- 3 Division Offices
 - CFL
 - EFL
 - WFL
- Deliver projects that access or are in:
 - National Parks
 - National Wildlife Refuges
 - National Forests
 - Bureau of Land Management Lands
 - US Army Corp of Engineers Lands
 - Bureau of Reclamation Lands
 - Department of Defense Lands



WESTERN FEDERAL LANDS HIGHWAY DIVISION

- Western Federal Lands Highway Division (WFL)
 - Located in Vancouver, Washington
 - Regional Project Office (RPO) located in Wasilla, AK
 - Serves Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana
 - Approximately 160 staff currently
 - Provides:
 - Planning
 - Project Development (design/ROW)
 - Construction advertisement and administration
 - Includes material testing verification in our AASHTO & ISO accredited lab
 - Technical services (capacity dependent)





FEDERAL LANDS TRANSPORTATION BILLS

FEDERAL LANDS HIGHWAY TRANSPORTATION BILLS

- Surface Transportation and Uniform Relocation Assistance Act, 1987
- Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA), 1991
- The National Highway System Designation Act (NHS), 1995
- Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21), 1998
- Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU), 2005
 - Named after Don Young's wife (Lu Young)
- Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21), 2012
 - 2-year bill +1 year extension
 - FLAP introduced with 9.03% match
- Fixing America's Surface Transportation Action (FAST Act), 2015
 - 5-year bill +1 year extension
 - FLAP continued with 9.03%
- Infrastructure Investment and Jobs (IIJA or BIL), 2021
 - 5-year bill (ends in 2026)
 - FLAP continued with no match required



IIJA OVERVIEW


- Signed into law in 2021
- 5-year bill authorized through FY26
- Requires a minimum 4-year program of projects
- Funds Federal Lands Highway Programs
 - Federal Lands Access Program
 (FLAP) program providing
 transportation access to Federal lands
 - Federal Lands Transportation
 Program (FLTP) program funding transportation within Federal lands
- Funds allocated annually

FEDERAL LANDS HIGHWAY TRANSPORTATION BILLS

Program	Annual funding
Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP)	\$286 - \$309 Million
Federal Lands Transportation Program (FLTP)	\$422 - \$456 Million
Tribal Transportation Program (TTP)	\$578 - \$628 Million
Nationally Significant Federal Lands & Tribal Projects Program (NSFLTP)	\$1,000 - \$900 Million

ALASKA FEDERAL LANDS ACCESS PROGRAM (FLAP)

Improving transportation facilities that provide access to, are adjacent to, or are located within Federal lands with an emphasis on high-use recreation sites and economic generators.





FLAP OVERVIEW

- Administered per Title 23, USC 204
- Must be a public transportation facility, including highways, roads, bridges, trails, or other transit systems
- Is located on, is adjacent to, or provides access to Federal Lands (NPS, FS, FWS, BLM, BOR, USACE, DOD)
- Title or maintenance responsibility is vested with State, Borough, Local Government, or Tribe
- Vested agency bears majority of the costs
- The Federal Lands Access Program focuses on ACCESS to FEDERAL LANDS
- Is a transportation program, not a grant program








FLAP ELIGIBILITY

- Is the project on a <u>public highway</u>, <u>road</u>, <u>bridge</u>, <u>trail</u> or <u>transit system</u>?
- Is it located <u>in</u>, <u>adjacent to</u> or <u>provides access to</u> Federal lands?
- Is the <u>title or maintenance</u>
 responsibility vested with the Local
 Public Agency (State, Borough,
 Local Government or Tribe) (must be
 documented in an agreement)?

APPLICANTS AND MATCH REQUIREMENTS

Applicants:

- The application is a joint application with the Local Public Agency (LPA) and Federal Land Management Agency (FLMA)
- Early and on-going coordination is key
- Applications are required to stay engaged through development and construction
- Available funding:
 - The FLAP program receives ~\$7.5M per year under IIJA. There's no project funding limit, however, be prudent with the funding available and leverage funding as much as possible.
- Match Requirements:
 - IIJA does not require match, however, IIJA expires in September 2026
 - Match requirements are <u>unknown</u> beyond 2026
 - Leveraging funds are encouraged to make the FLAP program go further.



PROJECT TYPES

- Capital Improvement:
 - Roads, bridges, trails
 - Rehabilitation, restoration, construction and reconstruction of roads and bridges
- Enhancement:
 - Roads and trail improvements
 - Includes interpretive signing, kiosks, viewpoints, adjacent vehicular parking areas, roadside rest areas (including sanitary and water facilities), provisions for pedestrians and bicycles, acquisition of scenic sites, trailheads, trails, and improvements that reduce vehicle-wildlife mortality
- Planning:
 - Engineering studies, corridor management planning,
 bicycle/pedestrian planning and alternative transportation planning
 - Provides valuable information for future FLAP proposals





PROJECT TYPES & FUNDING LIMITS

- Transit:
 - Construction of transit facilities
- Research:
 - Evaluate solutions that enhance access, safety, sustainability or innovation
 - Must be broad-based and applicable to multiple
 Federal Land Management Agencies (FLMAs)
- In the application, if your project does not fall into a certain category and the application is asking more about it, simply state that it's not applicable.
 - Example: The project is a capital improvement, and the application section is asking about planning, simply put not applicable.



PROPOSAL SELECTION

Programs Decision Committee (PDC)

Technical Advisory Group (TAG)



EVALUATION CRITERIA

- PDC makes final decision and considers:
 - Agency priorities
 - Previous Federal investments related to project
 - Right-of-way constraints and public support
 - Delivery agency
 - Preferred lead agency is WFL
 - Alaska DOT&PF or another Federal agency can deliver (ICAP and overhead applied)
 - Case-by-case determinations will be made for an LPA to deliver (S/O required)
 - Availability of funds and project scalability
 - FLAP funds are contingent upon available funding and authorizing legislation
- WFL will concur with project delivery and schedule the project delivery years
 - Construction in 2029, 2030, possibly 2031






CALL FOR PROJECT PROCESS & SCHEDULE



CHANGES & EVALUATION CRITERIA

- Changes:
 - Proposal form has been updated
 - Estimate is now in an Excel file but must be included in the PDF and as an Excel file
 - Three main delivery agencies (WFL, DOT&PF (includes ICAP), other Federal agency (includes overhead))
- Evaluation Criteria includes:
 - Federal High Use Recreation and Economic Generator
 - Safety
 - Asset Improvement
 - Mobility
 - Environmental Goals
 - Readiness and Support

TIPS FOR A GOOD PROPOSAL

- Start early with coordination, turn application in on time
- This is a joint application with the LPA and FLMA
- Get all correct signatures
- Make sure scanned documents are legible
- Be clear, concise, succinct, etc.
 - Be clear on the intended work
 - Be clear on any additional funding (not required but encouraged)
 - Sometimes you need to state the obvious!
- Write to the criteria look at the project evaluation criteria
- Remember Use the best cost data available
 - Use the excel calculator
 - Account for inflation (state the inflation criteria on the spreadsheet) for construction is in 2029, 2030 (possibly 2031)





TIPS FOR A GOOD PROPOSAL

- Maximize the use of limited funds by emphasizing:
 - Visitation through visitor use and acreage
 - Access high-use Federal recreation sites and Federal economic generators
 - Preserving existing access to Federal lands and restoring serviceability of the assets
 - Important access will be lost
 - Investment levels should be proportional to the % of use that is directly related to Federal lands
 - Proposals leveraging funds to make the project possible
- FLMAs are your friends!
 - Federal land user information
 - % Federal land related traffic
 - Mapping the federal lands
 - Help edit the proposal
 - Coordinate with your representative on the TAG!!!!



TIPS FOR A GOOD PROPOSAL

- Include a map
 - Show the Federal lands being accessed
 - Show the Federal high use recreation sites and Federal economic generators
 - Other Federal lands roads (FLTPI roads)
 - Project start and termini
 - Key features (bridges, major culverts, curve realignment, landsides, etc.)
- Include letters of support and pictures they're worth a 1000 words!
- If something is not applicable write "Not Applicable"
- Application submission:
 - Include a single PDF file (not a PDF portfolio)
 - Limit application to 30 pages (including a printout of the excel file for the estimate)
 - The PDF file size is limited to 10 mb
 - Include an excel file of the estimate (yes we will get it in the PDF but we want to see the calculations too!)
