NSFLTP Program Description

Program purpose

 To provide funding for the construction, reconstruction, and rehabilitation of nationally-significant projects on Federal or tribal lands.

Statutory citation

FAST Act § 1123, IIJA § 11127

Eligible Applicants

- Federal Land Management Agencies (FLMA)
- Tribal Governments
- States and local transportation agencies may also apply, but only if sponsored by an FLMA or Tribal Government.

NSFLTP Program Description

- Minimum Project Construction Cost \$12,500,000.
- 50% of the available funds must go to Tribal transportation facilities
- Not less than one eligible project from National Park Service for a unit with 3,000,000 annual visitors or more shall receive funds

Federal share

- 100% for Projects on Tribal transportation facilities
- 90% for other Projects not on Tribal transportation facilities
- Allows the use of Federal funding as match, including Title 23 and 49 funds

Funding Availability

 3 fiscal years following the fiscal year for which the amounts are appropriated.

Changes from the FY 2022 NSFLTP NOFO



The FY 2023 NOFO updated the funding available

Amendment #2 extended the application timeline from 60 to 120 days

FY 2023 NSFLTP funding available



The funding available for award in FY 2023 is \$88,290,000



\$44,145,000 Available for tribal transportation facilities

NSFLTP Eligibility Information

A single continuous project on a Federal lands transportation facility, a Federal lands access transportation facility*, or a tribal transportation facility*

*The facility is not required to be included in an inventory described in 23 U.S.C. sections 202 or 203 [FAST Act, section 1123(c)(1)];

- NEPA must be complete, as demonstrated through—
 - a record of decision with respect to the project;
 - a finding that the project has no significant impact; or
 - a determination that the project is categorically excluded; and
- The project must have an estimated total project cost equal to or exceeding \$12,500,000

NSFLTP Eligibility Information

- Eligible Activities
 - Construction related costs only
 - Design or preliminary engineering are not eligible activities/costs
- Eligible Applicants
 - FIMA
 - Tribal Governments
 - States and local transportation agencies* may also apply, but the application must include documentation that an FLMA or Tribe supports the project

*This includes States, local governments, political subdivisions of a State or local government, metropolitan planning organizations or MPOs, and special purpose districts or public authorities with a transportation function, including port authorities.

Sponsorship Coordinator

- Sponsorship Coordinator provides
 - FHWA a list of sponsored applications, including their own.
 - Enough detail to match the projects with applications.
- Each Tribe and FLMA should designate one person to be Sponsorship Coordinator.

Application and Submission Information

- All applications must be submitted in Grants.gov
- Content and Form of Application Submission
 - Standard Form 424, 424C, 424D, LLL, and Key Contacts
 - Cover Page
 - Narrative, including a project description, location, parties involved, funding, budgeting, project risks, and a discussion of how the project addresses Statutory and Discretionary criteria.
 - NEPA documentation, maps, letters of support

Application Review Information, Statutory Criteria

Statutory criteria

- Applications will be evaluated against the nine criteria provided in statute and in the NOFO:
 - Furthers the Department's goals, including state of good repair, economic competitiveness, quality of life, and safety;
 - 2. Improves the condition of critical transportation facilities, including multimodal transportation facilities;
 - 3. Needs construction, reconstruction, or rehabilitation;
 - 4. Has matching funds (projects with a greater percentage of matching funds rank higher than projects with a lesser percentage of matching funds);

Application Review Information, Statutory Criteria

Statutory criteria continues

- 5. Is included on or eligible for the National Register of Historic Places
- Uses new technologies and innovations to increase project efficiency;
- Is supported (whether for construction or for operation and maintenance) by funds other than those received under this program;
- 8. Spans two or more States; and
- Serves land owned by multiple Federal agencies or Indian tribes.

Application Review Information, Discretionary Criteria

Discretionary criteria

- Applies to all applications:
 - The project's demonstrated project readiness.
- Applies only to applications on Federal lands access transportation facilities or on Federal land transportation facilities (not on Tribal transportation facilities):
 - Is the project located in an underserved community? as defined in Executive Order 13985;
 - 2. The extent to which the project reduces greenhouse gas emissions and improves environmental justice;
 - 3. The extent to which the project will advance the Racial Equity and Barriers to Opportunity Program objective; and
 - 4. The extent to which the project will advance the Job Quality, Workforce Development, and Workforce Equity objective.

Application Review Information, application rating guidelines

Highly Recommended

- The project aligns extremely well with the objectives of the statutory criteria.
- Projects with 4 or more criteria rated as Strong Alignment
- Or Projects with all the statutory criteria rated as Alignment

Recommended

- The project
 aligns well with
 the objectives of
 the statutory
 criteria.
- Projects with at least1 criterion rated as Strong Alignment
- or Projects with most of the statutory criteria (5 or more) rated as Alignment

Acceptable

- The project that aligns with the objectives of the statutory criterion under consideration.
- Projects with no criteria rated as Strong Alignment but with several criteria rated as Alignment

Not Recommended

 The project does not align well with objectives of the statutory criterion under consideration or does not align with eligibility criteria.

Recommended, and Highly Recommended applications are sent to the FHWA <u>Administrator</u> as **Highly Rated.**

FHWA Administrator makes the final selections

Federal Award Administration Information

Notification of Selection

- The FHWA will announce awarded projects by posting a list of selected projects at https://flh.fhwa.dot.gov/programs/significant/
- Following the announcement, FHWA will call the point of contact listed in form SF-424 to initiate negotiation of a project-specific agreement
- The selection announcement is not an authorization to start work and incur cost.
- Recipients can only do work and incur costs after a grant/project agreement is in place

Federal Award Administration Information

Reporting

- Recipients of NSFLTP Program funding are responsible for meeting reporting requirements
- Federal Financial Report (SF-425) on the financial condition of the project bi-annually
- Annual Budget Review and Program Plan to monitor the use of Federal funds and ensure accountability and financial transparency in the NSFLTP Program
- FHWA reserves the right to request additional information, if deemed needed, to better understand the status of the project.






