



Putting the TTIP into Context: Tribal Transportation Program



- Established in 23 U.S.C. 202 to address the transportation needs of Tribal governments throughout the United States
- Provides safe and adequate transportation and public road access to and within Indian reservations, Indian lands, and Alaska Native Village communities
- Contributes to the economic development and self-determination of Indians and Native Americans
- TTP funds are allocated among Tribes using a statutory formula

TTIP Key Information



- TTIP must be "fiscally constrained"
- Projects that are not fiscally constrained in the TTIP will be considered a part of an "illustrative" list
- TTIP needs to be consistent with the Tribe's planning documentation
- TTP project route(s) and section(s) must be listed in the NTTFI
- Anticipated or available funding source(s) must be documented
- Coordination with State DOT and MPO as appropriate on regionally significant projects
- Compliance with relevant provisions in 25 CFR § 170
- Public must be provided the opportunity to review and comment


TTIP Submission



Next Steps in the Process...

- Tribe submits final draft TTIP package to FHWA via email
 - TTIP Certification, signed and dated by the Tribe's Chief, Chairpers
 President, or designated acting, or a supporting Tribal Resolution
 government action
 - Completed Microsoft Access FHWA TTIP Template
- Tribe and FHWA Tribal Coordinator ensure TTIP is complete
- FHWA works internally to obtain TTIP concurrence
