
The purpose of this hearing is to present 40% design plans and related information to the public and to listen to the community. The feedback you provide will be considered in future decisions about the project including a resolution on the proposed Limited Access Control Change (LACC) by the Virginia Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) and the Design Approval

milestone by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT).

This meeting will provide an opportunity for citizens and organizations to give FHWA EFLHD comments and/or suggestions on the proposed project. All members of the community will have the opportunity to participate in public decisions on transportation projects and programs affecting them.

FHWA EFLHD representatives are here to discuss the project and answer your questions. We included a comment sheet in this brochure, and we encourage your input.

Project Overview

To achieve the vision of the Arlington National Cemetery Southern Expansion (ANCSE), this project will realign Columbia Pike, modify the S. Joyce Street Intersection and the Columbia Pike/Washington Boulevard (Route 27) Interchange, and replace Southgate Road with a new segment of S. Nash Street. As part of the realignment, a new location for the Cemetery maintenance compound will be added to the south of Columbia Pike. The DAR project also will improve multimodal capacity and safety by adding pedestrian and bicycle facilities as well as street lighting. There will be no residential relocations as a result of this project. This project will result in a change of limited access control for Route 27 along the north side of the interchange and along the north side of I-395. The limited access line will be adjusted from north and west of the interchange along Route 27 and I-395 to the VDOT maintenance facility property line. This Limited Access Control Change (LACC) will be presented and discussed at this public hearing.

This project has been the subject of an Environmental Assessment in accordance with National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements. A Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) was issued by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in December 2019.

The goals of the interchange modification include:

- To improve safety and security
- To allow for more contiguous land for Arlington National Cemetery expansion
- To improve traffic and transit operations at signalized intersections
- To provide for more efficient pedestrian and bicycle access along Columbia Pike and through its interchange with Washington Boulevard
- To improve multimodal access to regional destinations, and maintain consistency with the Arlington County
 Master Transportation Plan, the Columbia Pike Multimodal Street Improvements Project, ANC expansion plans,
 and Pentagon 9/11 Memorial plans
