

QL-PAY 7 can import data from an existing QL-PAY 6 database. This is only needed when a user has QL-PAY 6 data that they want to bring into QL-PAY 7.

Before Starting

1. Make sure the QL-PAY 6 database file is available on the computer or on a location the computer can access.
2. The QL-PAY 6 database file should have a .qdb file extension.
3. Open QL-PAY 7 and make sure the correct QL-PAY 7 database is selected in Settings.

Steps

1. In QL-PAY 7, open the Sample Sets menu.
2. Select Import.
3. Select Import QLPAY6 Database ...
4. Browse to the QL-PAY 6 .qdb database file and select it.
5. QL-PAY 7 will convert the QL-PAY 6 data and open the normal import process.
6. Review the import prompts and choose whether to import or skip each lot as needed.
7. After the import is complete, the imported sample sets will appear in the Sample Set Selection list.

What To Expect

The QL-PAY 6 database is not edited by this process. QL-PAY 7 reads the QL-PAY 6 database, converts the selected data for import, and then saves the imported data into the active QL-PAY 7 database.

If the imported data conflicts with existing lots or property specifications, QL-PAY 7 will use the same import review process used for XML imports. The user may need to resolve conflicts before continuing.

XML Import And Export

The normal XML import and export process still works in QL-PAY 7. Use Import XML Doc ... when importing a QL-PAY XML transfer file. Use Import QLPAY6 Database ... only when importing directly from a QL-PAY 6 .qdb database file.

Troubleshooting

If the import does not complete:

1. Confirm that the selected file is a QL-PAY 6 .qdb database file.
2. Confirm that QL-PAY 7 is using the correct active database in Settings.
3. Try the import again.
4. If the import still fails, keep a copy of the QL-PAY 6 database file and contact support.
