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Chapter 2: Directory Structures

Project Directory Structure

Project related files, including CADD drawing files, survey and mapping data, and engineering data files, will be contained within a specific project directory structure. Files also contained within this directory structure include; correspondence, project documentation, reports, etc. Following the directory structure as indicated in this chapter will allow for consistent handling of all project files, as well as allow for easier archiving at project completion. The first level project directory is shown below, the following pages outline each first level directory in much greater detail, including subdirectories, purpose of each directory, and types of files typically stored within each directory.




Figure 2-1: Project Directory (Template)

While not all directories will be needed for each project, the structure naming convention must be followed where applicable. Sub-directories addressed in this chapter include Roadway, ROW, Survey, and Bridge.



The project directory structure has evolved over the last few years so the directory structure for older projects may not match what is shown here. The directory structure and file locations for older projects need not be changed. However, all new projects should use the directory structure outlined in this chapter.



Roadway

The primary sub-directories of the Roadway directory are detailed below. Individual files should not be placed under the root Roadway directory. These main subfolders within Roadway should not be edited.




Figure 2-2: Roadway Directory

Each sub-directory contains additional folders and/or specific files related to each project. The table below outlines the files to be contained within each sub-directory.

Folder	Content Description
CADD_Design CADD_Design Temp	This is the primary folder for current CADD files. Overall files used to prepare plans other than CFT transmitted files. Including; Alignment file, utility and drainage, traffic control, signing and striping, erosion control, superelevation shapes, patterns, surface, and overall cross-sections including ref-hub cross sections. The Design directory is used for design files only; no plan sheets. A Temp folder is added for design files that are a "work in progress" or not currently used in plan production which may be deleted.

B–Summ: Plan sheets with summary/quantities content. All Excel files used for summaries go under the Spreadsheets sub-folder.

C-ML_P&P: Mainline plan and profiles

D-Minor_P&P: Approach road plan and profile, layout plans, parking area plan sheets, intersection details

E, F, G, H, & K: Division 150-400, layouts, standards, details, and specials (categorized by FP section numbers)

R-500 & S-550: Division 500 and 550, Structural. Exact sheets and sheet names to be included will be determined and managed by structural group. Samples may include; bridge layout, wall layout, box culvert layout. Do not place copies of bridge group plan sheets in these folders.

T-600: Division 600 layouts, standards, details, and specials

X-ML_Xsec: Mainline cross-section sheets

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Y-Minor_Xsec: Minor road and Parking area cross-section sheets

Z-Drain_Xsec: Drainage crosssections including ditches and culvert cross-sections

Note that if a record of a project's plan submittal is desired, PDF's should be created and placed in the Deliverables_Submittals folder




Table 2-3: Roadway Sub-directory Files

Each project has unique requirements. For most projects this directory structure is adequate. It is acceptable to make changes based on the needs of specific projects. Examples of acceptable changes would be; the creation of a new Sheets subfolder "U-UCP" for inclusion of Utility Conflict Plans, or creating a T2-600 folder to separate the 600 Divisional sheets.



ROW

The primary sub-directories of the Right of Way (ROW) directory are detailed below. Individual files should not be placed under the root ROW directory. These main subfolders within ROW should not be edited.




Figure 2-4: ROW Directory

The primary sub-directories of the Survey directory are detailed below. Individual files should not be placed under the root Survey directory. These main subfolders within Survey should not be edited.




Figure 2-6: Survey Directory





Figure 2-8: Bridge Directory

CADD Resource Directory Structure (V8i_resource)

The CADD resource directories contain the standard CADD resource files detailed in the following chapters. These include set up, configuration, and resource files for MicroStation and GEOPAK such as MicroStation seed files and cell libraries, and GEOPAK database files and superelevation tables.



This portion of the chapter is for information only. For CFLHD employees the individual CADD machines have been configured with **project configuration files (.pcf)** to automatically find and attach these files. Use of fonts, line styles, etc., should be seamless.


For our consultants, the *V8i Edition of standard files download (V8i_resource.zip)* can be used to setup the standard CADD support directory structure. Project configuration file *(CFL-V8i_English.pcf)* is also provided in the download for the ease of setting up project configuration.

The standard CADD resource files are set up and maintained by the CADD Coordinator. The resource files are "read-only", as are the directories they reside in, so users cannot make changes to these files or create additional alternate versions of them on the server. These resource files are the "official" versions that should be used throughout CFLHD. Any errors discovered in these files should be reported to the CADD Coordinator so that they can be fixed.



The folder structure of the CADD resources within the V8i Edition has changed significantly from prior editions. This was done for interdivisional project sharing opportunities, to be more intuitive, clear and concise, and to separate files based upon MicroStation and GEOPAK application. Each division has their own unique or "local" resources as well as shared or "common" ones.





The CADD resource files (V8i_resource) are centrally located on the N: drive, and are accessed by all CFLHD users from there. CFLHD's three directories used under the V8i_resources directory are as shown below:




Figure 2-10: CADD Resource Files

The FLH_Common and CFL_Local folders are very similar in the sub structure. The key to location a file within the V8i_resources is to understand if the file is specific to a division or share commonly by all three FLH divisions. As advancements are made in the future, it is a goal for all divisions to share all files. Below are sub folder lists and a description of the files that are located in each. Significant resources will be identified as either CFL_Local or FLH_Common.
