The next step in the process will be to develop project agreements between Eastern Federal Lands Highway Division and the State/Local Agency partners.

The amount of funds allocated will depend on finalizing these agreements. Funding for these projects is not guaranteed. Funding beyond FY 2014 is dependent on reauthorization of the Access Program by Congress. The Missouri PDC does not have a firm date for the next call for projects under the Access Program, but another call is anticipated within the next year.
