

## Project Overview

The Western Federal Lands Highway Division of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), in partnership with the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF), is planning to rehabilitate 26 miles of the Glenn Highway. This project includes the Kings River Bridge (MP 66.5) to the Glenn Highway (MP 92).

## Purpose and Need

The purpose of this project is to enhance the safety of the highway and accommodate the anticipated traffic for the next 20 years. This rehabilitation project will:

- Preserve and extend the service life of the highway
- Provide climbing lanes
- Enhance safety
- Provide rock fall mitigation

## Environmental Review

FHWA completed the Categorical Exclusion documentation in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

## Glenn Highway

### Kings River Bridge MP 66.5

The existing Kings River Bridge needs structural and functional (*safety*) upgrades and is no longer cost-effective to maintain. Therefore, replacement is recommended.

In 2022, the project team completed the environmental compliance, plans, specifications, right of way acquisition and utility relocation plans to 100%.

The project is currently being advertised for construction bids, with a planned start of Spring 2023.
