Purpose and Need

The purpose of this project is to enhance the safety of the highway and accommodate the anticipated traffic for the next 20 years. This rehabilitation project will:

- Preserve and extend the service life of the highway
- Provide climbing lanes
- Enhance safety
- Provide rock fall mitigation

Environmental Review

FHWA completed the Categorical Exclusion documentation in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

Glenn Highway Kings River Bridge MP 66.5

The existing Kings River Bridge needs structural and functional (safety) upgrades and is no longer cost-effective to maintain. Therefore, replacement is recommended.

In 2022, the project team completed the environmental compliance, plans, specifications, right of way acquisition and utility relocation plans to 100%.

The project is currently being advertised for construction bids, with a planned start of Spring 2023.
