1. **What is the purpose of this Notice?** This Notice transmits the redistribution of Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (TIFIA) Program funds pursuant to the Fiscally Responsible Highway Funding Act of 2024 (FRHFA), Title I of Division B, Public Law (Pub. L.) 118-272. This Notice reflects a total of \$1,800,000,000 redistributed to the States. The distribution of these funds is shown in the attached tables.
2. **What is the background information?**
 - a. Pursuant to Section 2103 of the FRHFA, the Secretary shall distribute to the States \$1,800,000,000 in unobligated amounts of contract authority made available for credit assistance under: (1) the Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Program under Subchapter II of Chapter 1 of Title 23, United States Code (U.S.C.) as in effect before the date of enactment of SAFETEA-LU (Pub. L. 109-59; 119 Stat. 1144); and (2) the TIFIA Program under Chapter 6 of Title 23, U.S.C.
 - b. The amount under subparagraph (a) is distributed to the States in the same proportion as the distribution of Federal-aid highway program apportionments for Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 under Section 104(b) of Title 23, U.S.C.
3. **What is the availability of these redistributed funds?**
 - a. The funds are available for obligation until September 30, 2028. Any amounts not obligated by the State on or before that date shall lapse.
 - b. The funds resulting from this distribution are available immediately and shall be subject to obligation controls in force at the time of obligation. These funds are subject to the formula obligation limitation for the Federal-aid highway and the Highway Safety Construction programs. No new obligation authority is distributed with these funds.
 - c. The funds shall be in addition to any other funding apportioned to the States under Section 104(b) of Title 23, U.S.C.
 - d. Except as otherwise provided in Section 2103 of the FRHFA, the funds shall be administered as if apportioned under Chapter 1 of Title 23, U.S.C.

- e. The funds are available for any purpose described in Section 133(b) of Title 23, U.S.C., and are subject to the set-aside under Section 133(h) of such title.
- f. The funds shall be suballocated in the same manner as described in Section 133(d) of Title 23, U.S.C.
- g. The funds shall be subject to the requirements of Section 11101(e) of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), Pub. L. 117–58.
- h. The Federal share payable shall be in accordance with Section 120 of Title 23, U.S.C., except as provided by another provision of law. Section 133(h)(7) of Title 23, U.S.C., applies to funds set aside under Section 133(h) of such title.
- i. The funds set aside under Section 133(h) of Title 23, U.S.C., shall be included in the annual report required under Section 133(h)(8) of such title.
- j. The funds are not transferable under Section 126 of Title 23, U.S.C.
- k. The program codes to be used when obligating these funds are as follows:

4. What other provisions apply that are related to this redistribution?

- a. Pursuant to Section 2104 of the FRHFA, on April 1, 2025, the Secretary shall distribute to the States 75 percent of the contract authority made available for FY 2025 under the TIFIA Program pursuant to Section 11101(a)(2) of the (IIJA), Pub. L. 117-58, that is estimated to remain unobligated in such fiscal year. This redistribution will be provided via a separate Notice on April 1, 2025.
- b. Pursuant to Section 2105 of the FRHFA, on April 1, 2026, the Secretary shall distribute to the States 75 percent of the contract authority made available for FY 2026 under the TIFIA Program pursuant to Section 11101(a)(2) of the (IIJA), Pub. L. 117-58, that is estimated to remain unobligated in such fiscal year. This redistribution will be provided via a separate Notice on April 1, 2026.

5. **What action is required?** Division Administrators should ensure that copies of this Notice are provided to the State departments of transportation.
